Our reward, and our privilege, is to share and enjoy that success with them.


A SUCCESSFUL EDUCATION

Success in examinations is a vital part of school life, and at St. Andrew's College we are proud of our consistently outstanding track record of helping students to achieve superb exam results, and consequently to enter the United Kingdom's top universities.

Despite competing against schools that only recruit the most gifted students, and against schools made up largely of students who speak English as their native language, in 2015 St. Andrew's College was ranked in the top 200 schools in the United

Kingdom for A-level results (according to the UK Department for Education School and College Performance Tables). St. Andrew's College welcomes students of all abilities; it is therefore important to emphasize that for us, success is helping each student to reach their potential, whatever that level is.

This ranking was achieved because of all A-level exams taken, our students achieved an extraordinary 73 % of A* to B grades.





A SUCCESSFUL EDUCATION

The consequence of these excellent results is that in 2017 71% of our A-level students earned a place at a top 20 university and all but 4 of our A-level graduates went in to a university ranked within the top 30.

Our success is not confined to performance at A-level. 75% of St. Andrew's College Science Foundation Course students progressed to universities in the top 20 of the university ranking lists – and 100% of our students passing their foundation course gain a place at a UK university.

Behind these impressive statistics are a host of stories of individual accomplishment about which our students and their families should be as delighted as we are.





EDUCATION

PROGRESS TO UNIVERSITY

St. Andrew's College has a proud record of helping students into the top universities in the United Kingdom.

Preparation for university applications begins soon after the start of A-level and Foundation courses.

The application process can be complicated and daunting, so we have a team of experienced specialists ready to help our students with their applications.

There are over 100 universities in the United Kingdom and they offer an amazing range of courses in all academic disciplines.

Your personal tutor will start by introducing you to the options available to you. You'll talk about the different courses that relate to your preferred subject, and start to learn about which ones are most suitable for you.

Extra help and expertise is available for students applying to study in highly competitive fields such as medicine. Every year in October, soon after the start of the academic year, we invite universities to visit St. Andrew's College to talk directly to our students.

During the visit, staff from our partner universities make presentations and provide help and advice to our students.

It's an ideal opportunity for students to get detailed information about living and studying at the institutions that they may wish to apply to.



ENRICHMENT & EXTENSION

St. Andrew's College offers an Enrichment programme, which is available to all students.

Each week we invite speakers to talk to students about a range of topics. These talks aim to broaden students' awareness in subjects outside of their chosen fields as well as to add more depth to subjects being studied in college. Speakers are generally postgraduates or lecturers from Cambridge University.

We also encourage students to deepen their connections with the university and Cambridge culture by facilitating attendance at local events.

The Extension programme is for students aiming to apply for UK top-5 universities, in particular Oxford and Cambridge. Students in this programme work in small tutor groups to focus on their chosen subjects, working towards putting together an extended project. These groups are led by PHD students from Cambridge University.

Students are also given guidance on applications for top universities with help preparing them for interviews and entrance exams.

MEDICS' PROGRAMME

The St. Andrew's College Medics' Programme is a highly specialised two year programme of study for focused, high-achieving students looking for progression onto degrees in these competitive fields at leading universities.

The programme is designed for determined students who are looking for successful careers in Medicine, Veterinary Science and Dentistry.

Students study the following A-level subjects:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Physics and /or Mathematics

International students also study a specialised medicine related English language programme. All students on the programme benefit from regular seminars given by leading experts, in addition to their academic subjects. Seminar subjects include:

- Information on medicine degrees
- The requirements for becoming a doctor
- The NHS
- Topical issues
- Mock interviews

Students are expected to lead presentations and seminars on specific topics to develop and encourage their confidence and critical thinking skills in preparation for university interviews.

The Medics' Programme Tutor oversees all students on the programme, providing complete support and offering our brightest students the best possible chance of success in these highly competitive fields.





MOCK INTERVIEWS

A feature of applying to university in the United Kingdom is that many students will be interviewed by the universities to which they apply.

At St. Andrew's College we prepare students methodically for the interviews, so that they are not intimidating and students feel able to express themselves fully. Students undergo mock interviews and other practice work in order to be ready for University

interviews during their course; this preparation programme includes:

- In-house interviews with a panel of academic tutors
- External interview with panel of experts
- Group work on interview technique

These sessions train students to perform to the best of their ability when they are interviewed by their chosen universities.

WORK EXPERIENCE & VOLUNTEERING



St. Andrew's College Medics'
Programme students benefit from
our location in the university city
of Cambridge and from the
extensive network of contacts we
have cultivated in the university, at
the city's university teaching
hospital, and at other local
medical institutions.

As a result, students are able to undertake a series of work experience and volunteer placements to help support and enhance their application to pursue medicine.


Volunteering and charity work during term time also forms an important part of the pathway to a medical discipline degree course in the UK, and may include placements at Oxfam or the British Red Cross.

International students are strongly advised to undertake hospital work experience in their home countries during vacations, and our Principal assists with organising and arranging this.

SEMINARS

Students benefit from regular seminars from external specialists. These include topics such as research on the genetic links between cardiovascular disease and schizophrenia

There is no extra charge for this programme, but students have to demonstrate their suitability for participation through their previous exam results, and based on feedback from their teachers.





OUR SCHOOL

St. Andrew's College has two campuses in Cambridge, one on Station Road, and our newest site on Regent Street.

Principal Wayne Marshall is based at the Regent Street site, which is where students will study the bulk of their A-level subjects and is home to our art department.

Director Hanna Claydon is based at the Station Road site, which houses our science department.





RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION

St. Andrew's College owns six of its own residence buildings.

Students in each of these residences are looked after by a permanent member of staff who lives on site at the residence in separate accommodation; all the residences are available exclusively to St. Andrew's College students throughout school term time.

The smallest residence is home to eight students, whilst the largest houses 18. This means that they are small, friendly environments for students to live in.

The residences offer a safe, comfortable and convenient alternative to homestay accommodation, and they are located near the Station Road and Regent Street sites, such that students living in residence usually walk between their residences and school - though some prefer to live life in the Cambridge way, and cycle.

RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION



ROOMS

Our residential accommodation offers single and twin rooms. Most rooms are either fully en-suite or have their own shower and sink. Students can indicate their preferred room type when applying for their course.

All rooms are spacious enough for students to have ample room to live and study comfortably.

LIVING ROOMS

The residences each have a small living room area, where students are able to spend time relaxing together in the evening.



MEALS

Breakfast and dinner are prepared each day in the residences by our House Managers. Each residence has a dining area where students eat together in comfort.

Each residence has a separate area for boys and girls, with access from one area to the other not permitted after curfew time.

HOUSE MANAGERS


The House Managers at St Andrew's College residences are all permanent, full-time employees of the college.

They live in accommodation at their residence 52 weeks a year, and work hard to look after the students they are responsible for. Most of our House Managers have been with us for many years, and all of them are DBS police record checked.

They are all trained and qualified in child protection. food hygiene, allergens, first aid and fire marshalling.

HOMESTAY

Homestay accommodation at St Andrew's College allows students to understand more about living in the United Kingdom, because they see how local families live their daily lives. In this way they gain an understanding of the culture of the country that will be their home for a significant part of their lives.

Homestays are normally located a short bus or bicycle ride from our school campuses.

HOST FAMILIES

The families that provide accommodation for our students are all carefully selected and monitored by our Accommodation Officer, who knows all the families well and is experienced at choosing families that match the needs and wishes of individual students.

Many homestay families have worked with St Andrew's College for many years, and relish the opportunity to meet students from different backgrounds and cultures. Many of our students have formed long-term friendships with their homestay hosts, friendships which they have maintained for many years after leaving the school behind.

Most hosts make Wi-Fi available to students, and all provide a reasonable weekly laundry service.

MEALS

As in residence, breakfast and dinner are prepared each day for students in homestay accommodation.

ROOMS

Students in homestays always live in single rooms, though normally they will share the family bathroom.



EXTRA-CURRICULAR

Exam grades are a vitally important part of school life, but not the only part.

What young people do away from their classroom and their desk is also of fundamental importance to their growth as individuals.

At St Andrew's College we passionately believe that young people best develop key skills such as self-confidence, organisation, self-discipline and the ability to work as part of a team from participation in extra-curricular activities.

Cambridge offers a wealth of opportunities to young people in areas such as music, arts and sport.






St. Andrew's College offers a range of options to suit a broad spectrum of interests; students can choose from sports, social, cultural and academic activities.



GCSEs are the traditional route in to A-levels in the UK.

At St. Andrew's College GCSEs are taught in small classes, averaging just 4 students per class.

Students have weekly meetings with their personal tutor who will help guide them through their first year in UK studies. International students on the GCSE course stay in one of our nearby boarding houses, looked after by one of our full-time, live-in House Managers.

The St. Andrew's pre A-level course prepares students for A-level or Foundation courses offering a combination of English language training and IELTS exam preparation with some academic preparation in Sciences and Maths.

Students will study the GCSE syllabus in Sciences and Maths, however there is no requirement to take the exams at the end of the course, with progression to A-levels or a Foundation Course via our internal tests.

Much of the law studied at St. Andrew's is concerned with Common Law, but students also study European Law and the legal Institutions in the UK.







MEDIA, COMMUNICATION & FILM FOUNDATION COURSE

Students will be taught the knowledge, skills, concepts and key debates relevant to contemporary media. They will study expert examples in each area of the course, and will develop an analytical approach. This will include an introduction to the social, economic, political and business context of modern media, as well as to the technical, formal and aesthetic aspects of it. A strong emphasis is put on our commitment to enabling our students to achieve an excellent academic basis for further study at University.

The four core subjects are taught as independent units but are also inter-dependent. The aim is to deliver a theoretical and technical skills set that is transferable between subjects as well as an in-depth knowledge of each separate area of study.

Students will demonstrate their learning in the core subjects at the end of each term in the production of a portfolio, which will increase in complexity as the year progresses.

Students will be required to work consistently, as their work is evaluated through continuous assessment, not end of year exams. By the end of the year, students will be expected to be able to deliver work of a complex and highly competent nature in the making and understanding of digital media platforms, advertising campaigns, films and other types of communication texts.


